Medical Access Program (MAP) Demonstration Project (December, 2007)

We are asking physicians, dentists and other providers to participate in a new community demonstration project that aims to organize healthcare (including mental health and dental care) and social services for the uninsured who are not currently being seen by a healthcare safety net clinic. MAP will enable uninsured individuals who are not eligible for government health insurance programs to be enrolled in a limited community health services program. *The demonstration project requires a charity care commitment by a defined number of physicians and other providers in order to effectively test the administrative, technological and practical features of a new system of accessing care for the uninsured.*

For the MAP pilot, physicians and health service providers are being asked to:

- (1) Donate medical care with support from other healthcare and social services; **and**
- (2) Submit a zero-amount "claim" through a web-based portal, or via fax, for services rendered so MAP can quantify the value of care provided to MAP enrollees.

Note: MAP will first screen patients to confirm they cannot afford commercial insurance and they are not eligible for government-sponsored programs (OHP, FHIAP, Medicare etc.).

About the Medical Access Program (MAP)

- ❖ Is NOT an insurance program;
- ❖ Is designed to complement current safety net programs, NOT replace current access to care; and
- ❖ Coordinates primary care, specialty care, mental health, dental care, social service and ancillary care.

MAP Demonstration Project

- ❖ Patients will present a MAP Card in place of an insurance card to receive services.
- ❖ Patients will not be charged for basic primary care services, nor be subject to a program participation fee in the pilot stage.
- ❖ Nominal fees may be incurred for a subset of additional services (e.g., some medications, mental health visits).
- ❖ MAP clients will be enrolled for an initial six month period. A comprehensive program evaluation will identify project strengths and areas for improvement. Program specifics will be revised as needed to develop a successful and sustainable model.

MAP Office & Care Coordinator

- ❖ The MAP Office will coordinate services that are beyond the scope of primary care (i.e., specialty care, mental health, ancillary services, dental care, and social service providers).
- ❖ All MAP clients will enter the project through a MAP Care Coordinator.
- ❖ MAP will be supported by a web-based technology system that will provide the infrastructure in which volunteer and low-cost care can be delivered in a timely, effective and well-organized manner. Participating physicians and other providers will have access to the MAP Information System.

Goals for MAP Demonstration Project

- ❖ Screen and enroll 100 eligible patients, then assign clients to a medical "home".
- ❖ Ongoing assessment of primary care access and MAP's specialty care coordination.
- ❖ Assist with prescriptions, imaging and laboratory studies, mental health and dental care.
- ❖ Schedule appointments and complete referrals, then track encounters and utilization.
- ❖ Process "claims" through Agate Resources, Inc.
- ❖ Define, ensure and maintain HIPAA compliance and charitable immunity safeguards.
